## Follow Jesus by Following Matthew

- Lst wk J tght us: by nature, we lost. In sinful nature, aprt fr faith/Xp, we all: lost in unbelf, seprtd fr God, condmnd etrnl dth – lost like: shp stuck in thekt, or coin burd undr dirt flr. But J found us: bright us faith & made own. And not just us. J has S/F many other lost shp/coins, incldng spcl indvdl we get think re today: man, Mt (Levi). Wish knew why 9/21 was dsgntd St. Mt's day. Lookd into; cldn't find answr. All know: going back as early as 400s, Xians've set aprt 9/21 as day remem/thank God for Mt. And whnvr we celbrt these minor festvls (saint days, like St. Mt), we certnly not: worshpng, praying, elevting divine status, or expctng intrvn in lives. We wrshp Lord alone; he: helper. But Mt: real prsn; & J chose him as 1/12. Mt: apstl. Means: walkd/talkd w/J; saw mrcls; was givn ability perfrm mrcls (dmns; sick); at table when J insttd HC; at mnt/Olvs when J ascnd hvn. And if all that not engh, Mt: also chosen by HS write insprd accnt J's life: bk we call Gos/Mt. Mt: both apstl (12) & evnglst (Gos-wrtr). Only other prsn both A/E: Jn, aftr whom ch namd. So Mt: pretty imp guy – not bec so holy/spcl in/of self (as soon see). But Mt is an excllnt exmp for us of what means follw J. Vs. 9b. J calls us follw him too. And we can learn lot re what means follw J by follwng Mt & his exmpl.
- Mt: tax collctr; means despisd by fellow Jews 2 reasons. 1) Workd for Rmns. Jews hatd Rmns bec contrlld land & ruled over ppl. Working for Rome made you traitor to own ppl. And 2) Way tax colletr earnd income: by charging hefty % above base tax rate. So, if Rome regrd 18% tax, guy like Mt cld chrg 25/35%, and just pocket extra. And just like today, ppl hate paying taxes. But back then, nvr sure how much going to: Rome & some greedy tax collctr's prsnl bnk accnt. To be a tax collctr like Mt meant you: despisd traitor who stole fr own ppl to make dishonest profit & support Rmns.
- And of all ppl to be his follwr, J chooses Mt tax collctr! Vs. 9b. We can learn lot re follwng J by follwng Mt's exmpl. 1st, to folly J, Mt left behnd very good paying job. M: probly one withst ppl in Gal (nice home, fancy clths, plnty fd/drnk). But quit job, left all behnd, bec recgnzd sin/occptn (love/\$, greed, dishnsty); and priortzd J over \$. If we going follw J like Mt did, then we too need leave behnd whtvr sins may be part our life. Maybe our sin is same as Mt's: love/\$, greed. We certly: wlthy ppl (nice homes, fancy clths, plnty fd/drnk). And not wrong be wlthy. But what is wrong: loving yr wlth more/J, priortznd \$ above J. If you fail to consstntly give genrs offrng to Lord (10%/incm always baseline), then you're stealing fr God & loving \$ more than Lord. If you: not generous w/wlth, helpful to others; if you are greedy, stngy, dishonst - then those: sins you've got leave behnd in order follw J. And doesn't have be \$-related sins. God: be sexually pure; no sex outside marg; no filthy imgs/vids. Be verbally pure; do not curse/swr/lie/decv or use filthy lang. But if sexual or verbal sins have chrctrzd our lives, then we've got look at those sins, say: I'm done w/this! Leave it behnd. Leave tax cllctng booth, for good. Have that level of complete commtmnt to Sav, like Mt did. That's how we are going follw J.
- Nxt, we can follw Mt's exmpl of follwng J by sharing Gos w/frnds. Look what Mt did: vs. 10. Mt threw dinner party for J & invitd frnds: probly other withy tax colletrs & infintl bsnssmn (Phars: sinners). Mt got'em all tog so could meet J. When J called Mt to follw him in faith, that was so life-chngng for him: wanted others to exprnc J too! So intrded them to J. What if we did same thing? What if we intrded our non-Xian frnds to J? What if invitd them to a gathrng where they'd meet J & hear Word? And wldn't most natural gathrng place for that kind/mtg be right here, at ch, in wrshp; isn't this our usual get-tog? What if we invite our frinds to this, just like Mt invited his frinds to meet J? It's called frindship evinglem, and it is today statistely by far most effective form/outreach: persnlly inviting ppl to come to ch & sitting w/them in wrshp. Mt did it centuries ago, setting an exmpl for us to follw.
- Here's anthr way we will follw Mt: as follwrs/J, we will be lookd down upon by wrld. Non-Xians will think less of you spefely bec you: Xian. Vs. 11. That: wasn't genuine regst/info; accstn belittling J & his ppl. In last few decades, a seismic shift has taken place: Xianity's gone fr being genrly acceptd in seclr culture to more/more being unaccptd, even villainizd as relg of bigotry, prejudice, and hate-spch. Gos has always been hated, but an alarmingly increasing # ppl are speaking out vs true Xianity very publicly, negtvly - which means our chldrn/grndchldrn'll grow up in wrld that's much less accepting of Xp than our prnts/grndprnts wrld. We need undrstnd that & be prprd for it! J: "Whyr wants be my disc must

deny selves & take up their cross & follw me" (Mt 16:24). Mt: probly martyrd for his faith. Bearing a cross & follwing J will become increasingly challngng for us, as well – J promsd would be. But also promsd incrdbl blessings & peace for his follwrs. Mt knew that; we know it too.

- Anthr way to follw J by follwng Mt: turn to our Dctr. J: vs. 12b; 13c. J not come into this wrld to gather the good ppl (righteous/hlthy) bec there are none! He came gather ppl who knew they: sick/sinful and make them better. We call J: Great Phscn body/soul bec he not only heals our physcl ailments; also restores sin-sick souls. But we'll nvr exprnc that healing fr Dctr J if don't first recgnz our sprtl sickness. Phars thought perfly hlthy. Mt knew sick. If we ignore our spirtl sickness (like Phars), then it'll only get worse & evntly kill us. J wants us turn to him as our Dr/Physcn/Sav who alone can heal us. His sinless life heals us; dth cross heals us; his res fr dead heals us. Mt trstd in Dctr J. We follw his exmpl when we put our trust in our Dctr/Sav.
- Finly, J seeks a sincere hrt. Why quotes proph Hosea: vs. 13ab. Well, God wanted scrfcs; commndd them. But what really wants: your hrt. Don't come to ch, go thru service, give your offrngs, volntr in cong just going thru motions. Do it w/sincere hrt. Vs. 13ab. J: "Yes, I want your offrngs but even more: I want your hrt. I want you see my hrt/mercy twrd you. I lived/died/rose for you, bec I love you w/my whole hrt. And I forgive you when you don't love me w/your whole hrt. But I still want your hrt." When we see how J loves us w/his whole hrt, that moves/motvts us to love J (wrd/will) w/our whole hrt.
- So, vs. 13a. One way go/learn: read bk Mt wrote, Gos/Mt. Did you know Mt is only Gos-wrtr to record J saying: "You: light/wrld... Let your light shine before others, that they see good deeds & glorify Fr/hvn" (5:14-16); "Come to me all weary burdnd rest; take my yoke upon you & learn fr me, for I gentle, humble/hrt; and you'll find rest souls" (11:28-29); "Where 2/3 come tog in my name, there I am w/them" (18:20); "Come, you who blessd by Fr; take your inhrtnc, kngdm prepd for you since crtn/wrld" (25:34); "All authrty hvn/earth givn me. Thrfr go make discs, baptzng FSHS, & tchng them obey evthng cmmndd. And surely I am w/you always very end age" (28:18-20)? These precious wrds/J were recorded only by Mt. Mt went fr being hated traitor to chosen disc; fr dishonest tax colletr to A/E of J. It's only by grace that J called Mt; and only by grace that J calls us. He calls us to follw him in faith. And today we can learn lot re follwng J by follwng Mt & his exmpl. Happy St. Mt's day!
