

Habakkuk 1:1-3; 2:1-4 (EHV)

- $^{\scriptscriptstyle{1:1}}$ The threatening oracle which the prophet Habakkuk saw.
- ² How long, LORD, must I cry for help, but you do not listen? I call out to you, "Violence!" but you do not save! ³ Why do you cause me to see injustice? Why do you overlook misery? Devastation and violence confront me. There is strife, and tensions rise.
- ^{2:1} I will stand at my watch post and station myself on the city wall. I will look to see what he will say to me, and what answer he will give to my complaint.
 - ²Then the LORD answered me. He said:

Record the vision and write it plainly on tablets so that a herald may run with it.
